Annual Maywood Bataan Day Memorial Service Marks 68th Anniversary in 2010

MAYWOOD, IL – As they have every year since 1942, the Village of Maywood and the Maywood Bataan Day Organization will mark Maywood Bataan Day on the Second Sunday in September. This year the Memorial Service will be held on Sunday, September 12th at 3pm at Maywood Veterans Memorial Park at the corner of 1st Ave. and Oak St. in Maywood, IL.

Each year since 1942, friends, family and community leaders have gathered to pay tribute to the Maywood National Guardsmen, who served in the Philippines at the beginning of World War II. Most of these men did not return and the story of their tribulations has recently been documented on television specials and a movie, “The Great Raid”. Today, the Memorial Service has grown to encompass veterans from all wars and includes active participation from the Filipino-American community in Chicago in memory of the many thousands of Filipinos, who also lost their lives, defending the Philippines in WWII, shoulder to shoulder with Americans.

Master of Ceremonies will be MBDO Vice President, Edwin H. Walker IV. Colors will be presented by several area American Legion, VFW, and ROTC Color Guards. In past years color guard units from Maywood, Melrose Park, Berwyn, Hillside, Des Plaines, Chicago, Palatine, Elmhurst, Frankfort, Mokena, River Forest, LaGrange, Northlake and many other Chicago and suburban cities have participated. This year, a group of WWII reenactors, in the uniform of infantry soldiers stationed in the Philippines at the beginning of WWII, will lead the parade of colors. Preceding the service will be a concert by the Ceremonial Band from the Navy Band Great Lakes, Chief Harold Mahannah, Director.

Keynote speaker will be Major General William L. Enyart, IL Adjutant General, Illinois National Guard.

The ceremonies will include a featured speaker, John D. Lukacs, author of “Escape From Davao”, the story of the escape of a dozen POWs from Davao POW camp in the Philippines in the days following the Bataan Death March. John D. Lukacs, a writer with a budding reputation as a World War II and sports historian, specializes in one-of-a-kind stories—the unusual, the unprecedented and the virtually unknown. His work has appeared in USA Today, The New York Times, ESPN The Magazine and ESPN.com. Lukacs is a frequent contributor to ESPN.com, has appeared as an on-air commentator on ESPN, and also has worked on projects with other ESPN entities such as Outside the Lines and Classic Sports Reporters.

Col. Richard A. McMahon, Jr., President of the Maywood Bataan Day Organization extends an invitation to the entire community, saying, “All members of the public are encouraged to attend and pay tribute to these American and Filipino heroes.”

In case of inclement weather, the event will be moved to the Maywood Public Library at the west end of Maywood Park (corner of 5th Avenue & St. Charles Road).

The Maywood Bataan Day Organization is dedicated to preserving the memory of Bataan Day and perpetuating the observance of Maywood's Bataan Day on the second Sunday of September.
